<u>Topic</u>

PSHE



Mathematics

We will be following the White Rose curriculum.

This term, the children will be learning about the following: Reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers to 10 million. Rounding

Using negative numbers in context and calculating intervals across zero. Solving addition and subtraction multi-step problems.

Multiplying and dividing numbers up to 4/5 digits by a 2-digit number using formal written methods.

Use their knowledge of the order of operations to carry out calculations involving the four operations.

Throughout each week, the children will be given opportunities to demonstrate their reasoning skills and to problem solve.

Homework will be set on Seesaw every Monday. Your support in this process is invaluable and will have such a positive effect upon your child's learning and progress.
