Literacy

Children will continue to practise their ongoing punctuation and sentence structure skills with the use of capital letters, full stops, nouns, adjectives and verbs.

Our focus this term is on how to use prepositional language as well as conjunctions to add two pieces of information together. We will also learn how to use noun phrases to retell a story.

Hello!

Welcome to the Term 6 newsletter. We have a wonderful term planned for Oboes exploring 'Hey let's explore the UK'. The children will be learning all about the four countries that make up the UK and their capital cities. The children will also be learning about the different plants that grow in the UK and what plants need to grow.

This term is also our school trip to Wingham Wildlife Park!

Topic

In topic this term, children will be learning about the United Kingdom and its features. We will be linking this into other subjects such as science and looking at the different plants that grow in the UK. We will be going on another local walk to find different plants that grow in our local area. Children will also have a go at planting and growing their own plants. In DT this term children will be making different foods from the United Kingdom.

Maths

In Maths this term, we will begin with our learning on multiplication and division. Children will be learning about grouping and sharing to make equal groups.

Next we will be focusing on the place value of numbers up to 100.

We will also be having maths focus days on position and direction and time, where the children will spend the day becoming familiar with the vocabulary used to fully immerse into the topic.

Rainbow challenge

The children will continue to complete rainbow challenges based on their learning in: Literacy, Maths, Topic, Art and Fine motor skills.

Read Write Inc (RWI)

This term the children will be sitting their phonics screening check. Please remember to practise the speed sounds that were sent home at the end of last term.

Great progress is being made in children's RWI lessons. Children show great resilience in their learning and continue to impress us daily. Please continue to read and listen to your child every day. This really supports children's progression, fluency and builds vocabulary.

Spellings

Spellings will be set weekly on a Friday for children to learn over the week. They will be tested the following Friday. Some children have moved groups, so please ask if you are unsure of your child's spelling group.
