<b>Monday</b> <b>21st June</b>	<b>Making Words</b> <b>europEAn words</b>  The word 'European' contains the sound 'ea' such as 'ea cup of tea' in the Read Write Inc programme. Can you list as many words as possible containing the 'ea' sound?	<b>Counting Time</b>  Play a game of football together that includes moving the ball to your family member and practise counting at the same time.  How many passes did you manage?	<b>Writing Task</b>  Think of questions you would ask any football player or team coach about representing their country in a huge worldwide competition.  <b>Can you think of one which uses each of these question starters?</b>  when, why, who, what, where, how, which, how many, how much...	<b>Design a new country football kit</b>  Create a new kit for any of the countries in the competition. Can you design it and get your family to guess which country it is for? Can you research and use the colours that match that countries flag?
<b>Tuesday</b> <b>22nd June</b>	<b>Let's Get Writing</b>  Who is your favourite player?  Create a list of words to describe this person and then create a description of them with a picture at the top. Ensure you use full sentences and different sentence starters.	<b>Food Tasting fun</b>  Draw a picture of 10 different pieces of fruit or vegetables from around the world.  Can you name the country that it links to, who are currently playing in the football competition and ask a family member if they can match the country with the piece of food?	<b>Art fun</b>  Design your very own team kit.  Perhaps consider the flag of a country to represent and how to incorporate these colours into the design. Draw the design with a pencil or use a computer program	<b>Geography fun</b>  Can you use an atlas or a map and locate countries that are part of the euros 2021 football competition?  Can you then choose two ad research about the two countries and write some facts about what is different and what is the same about them?
<b>Wednesday</b> <b>23rd June</b>	<b>Puzzle Fun</b>  Can you have some family time and complete a puzzle together?  You can take as long as it needs to complete it, even over several days, but make sure you work together as a team.	<b>Play 'Kicking and Counting'</b>  Use a ball and carefully pass to a family member. Can you see how many successful passes you manage to make and then find number bonds to match that total?	<b>Design a football safe obstacle course</b>  Can you create a sporting obstacle course in your house or in your garden that your family members have to complete and enjoy?  They need to be able to complete the course	<b>Computer Time</b>  <b>England, Wales and Scotland are all in the football competition.</b>  Which county do we live in?
